Fuel Total Systems California Corporation is a U.S. subsidiary of Japan-based FTS Co., Ltd. FTSCA was established in November of 2001. They broke ground in June, 2002 and the plant was completed in February, 2003. FTSCA produces plastic fuel tanks. Tanks made of resin and of plastic compound materials facilitate lighter weight vehicles and thereby meet stricter emission requirements. FTSCA recently received the Tacoma Launch Award from Toyota. FTSCA supplies fuel tanks to New United Motor Manufacturing, Inc. and Toyota Motor Manufacturing Baja California.
